

CSM Training for Beginners: What You Should Know

Earning the Certified ScrumMaster (CSM) certification is a great choice for those interested in Agile project management or expanding their role on a Scrum team. Anyone who is new to Agile or coming from a traditional project management background should know the main principles of Scrum and practice using them.

In this post, we'll cover all the basics of CSM certification, the reasons training is helpful, what to expect when learning and how to make the most out of it from the beginning.

Why Scrum and Why Now?



For software development and even other areas, Agile is the leading standard. Scrum, which is part of Agile, puts importance on people working together, being flexible and making frequent improvements.

Many organizations are implementing Scrum to reduce the release time, create top-quality products and stay flexible to what customers want.

Because of greater demand, the role of ScrumMaster is now more significant. A ScrumMaster serves as a coach, a protector of Agile values and a leader who helps everyone in the team.

At the beginning, a beginner ScrumMaster should take courses, understand the key points of Scrum and get the needed certification.

What is CSM Certification?

Scrum Alliance which is recognized as a key organization in Agile, provides the CSM credential. The certificate proves that you know the basics of Scrum, who does what in a team and what are the important Scrum ceremonies and artifacts.

For certain groups, CSM certification is very beneficial for;

- Aspiring ScrumMasters
- Project managers are now using Agile ways of working.
- Members of Scrum teams may be developers, QA testers or UX designers.
- Anyone responsible for building a team wants to be aware of its dynamics.
- Those who are interested in Agile transformation

The procedure includes joining a two-day (16-hour) training program with a Certified Scrum Trainer (CST) and passing the CSM exam. The real benefit is found in the **CSM training**, not only in the certificate.

CSM training is designed to be a hands-on and engaging way to learn. You will work in groups, use simulations, study cases and practice real-life examples to support your knowledge of Scrum.



The following are the common topics you'll cover in CSM training:

1. **Scrum Theory**

Agile values and principles, Scrum framework and the roles of ScrumMaster, Product Owner and Development Team are the main parts of Scrum.

2. **Scrum Events**

Each team takes part in Daily Scrum, Sprint Planning, Sprint Review and Sprint Retrospective.

3. **Scrum Artifacts**

Involved in the process are Product Backlog, Sprint Backlog and Increment.

4. **Servant Leadership**

Coaching, solving conflicts and facilitating teams.

5. **Scaling Scrum**

An overview of frameworks such as SAFe, LeSS or Nexus for bigger groups.

At the end of the training, you will know Scrum and be able to use it with real projects.

Choosing the Right CSM Course

Some CSM courses are better than others. These are some points to keep in mind when you select a training provider:

1. **Accreditation:** All Scrum Alliance-recognized CSTs must teach Scrum courses for them to be valid.
2. **Trainer Background:** Choose trainers who have worked in the industry and can give useful recommendations.
3. **Format:** Pick the way you want to take your classes: live-online, in-person or at your own pace.
4. **Student Feedback:** Look at comments and reviews from people who attended the conference before.

It's important to consider your preferred way of learning. There are those who learn more from watching and there are those who learn more from talking with a group. Find a course that suits the way you prefer to study.

What to Expect from the CSM Exam

A CSM exam is an online, 60-minute test that has 50 multiple-choice questions. To pass, you must answer at least 37 of the questions correctly (that is, 74%).

Some of the subjects discussed are Scrum roles, Scrum events, Scrum artifacts and Agile principles.

Although the exam is commonly found to be straightforward by those who have been well-prepared, it still needs to be taken seriously. Here are some things you can try:

- **Make sure to review the Scrum Guide:** You can depend on this document as your ultimate reference.
- **Do sample tests:** They introduce you to the way tests are designed.
- **Discuss and resolve any uncertainties as they arise during training:** Questions should be freely asked to your trainer for help.
- **Join study groups to help yourself learn:** Working together with colleagues can help you understand the material more strongly.

Passing the CSM exam improves your CV and lets you feel confident about using Scrum at work.

What Happens After Certification?

Earning the CSM certification is only the first step. Being certified will allow you to join the Scrum Alliance's international community of practitioners.

There are exclusive webinars to take part in, regional Agile groups you can join and top certifications such as Advanced CSM (A-CSM) and Certified Scrum Professional (CSP-SM) that you can earn.

At work, you can arrange Scrum meetings, guide teams and get rid of the barriers they meet. Eventually, you will switch your focus from managing daily activities to encouraging changes in the culture and organization.

CSM puts you in a better position when you are seeking employment. Firms want to hire Agile experts who are able to guide their teams to complete projects successfully.
