Whether you want to meditate alone or take a break with your family and friends, a tour in Eden Nature Park is worth it.



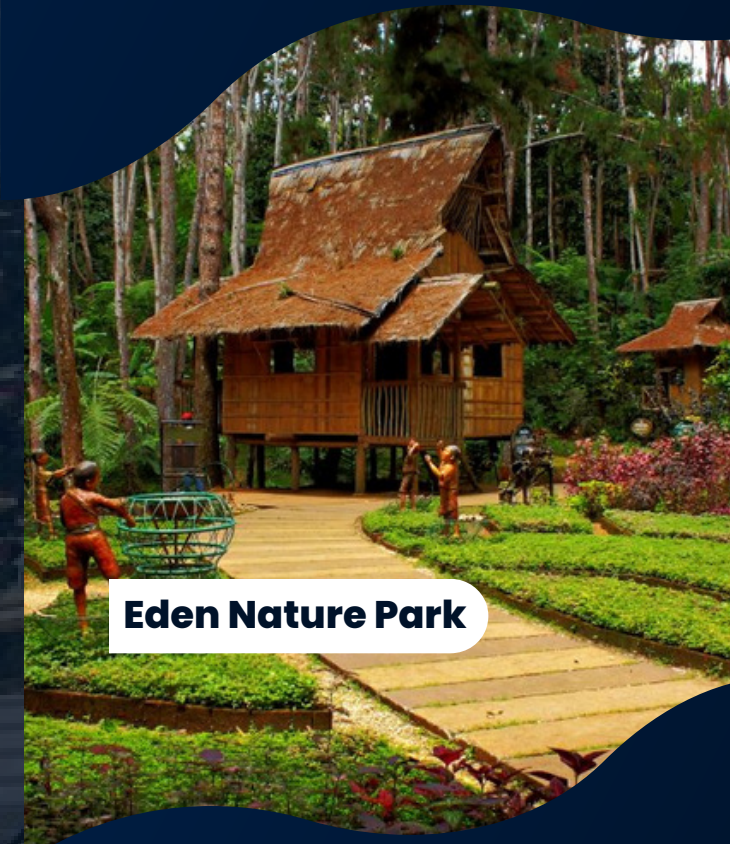
D'bone Collector Museum

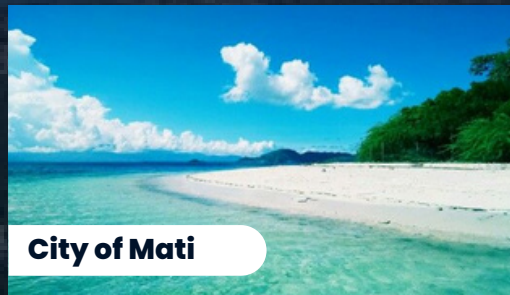


Mount Apo

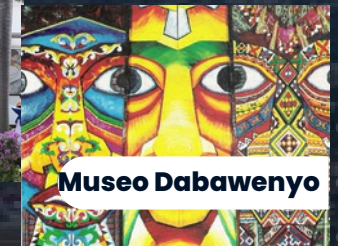


Eden Nature Park
